### **Mayoral Election**

The West of England Combined Authority covers the area of Bath & North East Somerset, Bristol and South Gloucestershire. On Thursday 4 May 2017 electors from these areas will have the opportunity to vote for the person they want to be Mayor for the West of England Combined Authority until 2021.

The West of England devolution deal brings powers and money from national Government and the ability to make more decisions locally. The West of England Combined Authority Mayor will work alongside the Bristol Mayor and Council Leaders of Bath & North East Somerset and South Gloucestershire to create a strategy for the combined area.

#### About this booklet

This booklet must be sent to you by law\*. It includes:

- information about the election
- an election address (i.e. a statement) from each of the Mayoral candidates
- information on how to fill in your ballot paper and how the result will be calculated
- frequently asked questions

Your vote is important in deciding who the future West of England Combined Authority Mayor will be.

Candidates are listed in alphabetical order below. This is the order in which they will appear on the ballot paper.



The order in which the statements of candidates appear in this booklet has been determined by the drawing of lots by the Deputy Combined Authority Returning Officer, in accordance with The Combined Authorities (Mayoral Elections) order 2017.

#### Voting information

Every registered eligible elector will be sent an official poll card which will explain when, where and how to vote.

#### How to cast your vote

When you get to your polling station, you will receive a ballot paper for the Mayoral election. Postal voters will have this ballot paper in their pack.

This election uses the supplementary voting system.


You will have two votes – one for your first choice candidate and one, if you wish, for your second choice candidate.

The ballot paper will list all the candidates standing. Next to the list of candidates there will be two columns.

Vote by putting an X in column A, next to the name of the candidate who is your first choice.
 You must vote in this column for your first

choice to be counted.


- 2. Vote by putting an X in column B, next to the name of the candidate who is your second choice.
  If you do not vote in this column, your first choice yote will still be counted.
- **3.** If you vote twice for the same candidate, your second vote will not be counted.
- 4. You should not mark more than one X in the first choice column A, and you should not mark more than one X in the second choice column B. If you have marked a first choice, you can choose whether or not to mark a second choice. If you only mark a cross in the second choice column, your vote will not be counted.



#### Who is elected?


#### All the first choices are counted:

If one candidate has received more than 50% of the votes they will be elected Mayor.



#### If no candidate has more than 50% of the vote:


The two candidates with the most first choice votes will remain in the election and **all other candidates are eliminated**.



Mayor for West of England Combined Authority



The ballot papers for the **eliminated candidates** are then checked. Any second choice votes for the two remaining candidates are added to their first round totals. The candidate with the most votes wins.



#### Frequently asked questions

#### • What is devolution?

West of England devolution is a deal with national Government to transfer some of its funding and decision making powers to the West of England region (Bath & North East Somerset, Bristol, South Gloucestershire). As part of the deal we need to have a regional authority and an elected regional Mayor.

#### What powers does the West of England Combined Authority have?

It will have the ability to make local decisions about spatial planning for the region (including where new homes are planned and where investment in new services is needed to support their development), adult education and skills, employment and regional transport.

#### What is the difference between the West of England Combined Authority Mayor, Council Leaders and the Bristol Mayor?

The West of England Combined Authority Mayor will be responsible for the additional powers and money devolved to the West of England Combined Authority. The Bristol Mayor and Council Leaders of Bath & North East Somerset and South Gloucestershire will continue to be responsible for all of their current council services, except where they choose (or have chosen) to transfer some of their powers to the Combined Authority.

#### What happens to the existing local councils?

Bath & North East Somerset, Bristol and South Gloucestershire councils will still exist. The West of England Combined Authority powers are in addition to and complement the existing powers within the local councils.

#### • Why two votes for one Mayor?

The law states the voting process for the Mayoral elections must be done this way. It also allows you to say who would be your second choice for Mayor if your first choice is not in the top two after the first round of counting, and if there is not an outright majority winner at that stage.

#### • I have lost my poll card, can I get another one?

If you are on the electoral register, you don't need a poll card to vote. You can attend the polling station and staff there will help you. The poll card is just to inform you that there is an election and explain where your polling station is.

#### Why has every voter in my household been sent a booklet?

The law says that every registered voter must be sent their own copy, so they get a chance to see who the candidates are.



#### The experienced choice





#### #LOCALPEOPLEFIRST
