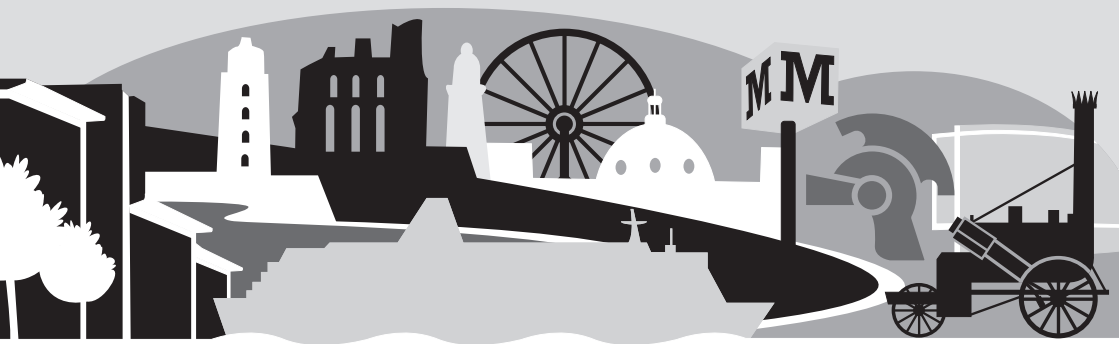

Introduction

On 6 May 2021, you, the residents and voters of North Tyneside will be able to vote in the election to choose the Mayor of North Tyneside.

About this booklet

This booklet must be sent to you by law*. It includes:

- Information about the election
- An election address (i.e. a statement) from each of the Mayoral candidates who wish to be included in this booklet
- Information on how to fill in your ballot paper and how the result will be calculated
- Frequently asked questions

Your vote is important in deciding who the future Mayor of North Tyneside will be.

Voting at the Mayoral Election

Five candidates are standing for election for the Mayor of North Tyneside. They will be listed alphabetically on the ballot paper.

The Mayoral candidates are:

John Christopher Appleby
Liberal Democrat

Norma Redfearn
Labour Party

Penny Remfry
Green Party

Steven Paul Robinson
The Conservative Party Candidate

Jack James Thomson
UK Independence Party (UKIP)

Each candidate was given the opportunity to provide an election address to be included in this booklet. All candidates chose to do so and they have each paid £750 towards the printing cost of the booklet.

How can I vote?

At your polling station

Before 6 May 2021 you should have received a poll card which includes the name and address of your polling station. You can also use the Find my Polling Station function on the election page at www.northtyneside.gov.uk to locate your polling station. You do not need to take your poll card with you in order to vote (unless you are an anonymous voter) but it may save time if you do. You can only vote at the polling station stated on this card.

On 6 May 2021 polling stations will be open between 7am and 10pm for you to cast your vote. When you arrive at the polling station you will be asked for your name and address. Staff will check that you are on the electoral register and will give you a ballot paper.

We are working very hard to ensure polling stations are safe places to vote. They will be very different this year with voter safety at the forefront of the operation. This will involve social distancing, one way systems, queuing, the use of hand sanitizer and wearing a face covering will be mandatory, unless exempt.

If you are concerned about visiting a polling station under these circumstances you may wish to consider applying for a postal or proxy vote. Details of how to do this can be found on the next page.

Applying to vote by Post or Proxy

Anyone who is registered to vote can apply to vote by post or appoint someone they trust to vote on their behalf as a proxy.

If you wish to make a new application for a postal vote or to appoint someone to vote on your behalf as a proxy, you may download a form from www.yourvotematters.co.uk or ask the Electoral Registration Office to send you the form. Contact details for the Electoral Registration Office can be found at the back of this booklet.

Your completed postal vote application form must be received by the Electoral Registration Office no later than 5pm on 20 April 2021. If by the time you have received this booklet the postal vote application deadline has passed, there is still time to appoint someone to vote on your behalf as a proxy. The deadline for new applications for a proxy vote is 5pm on 27 April 2021.

If you are already registered as a postal voter, your postal vote will be sent to you around 21 April 2021.

When you receive your postal voting pack, please follow the instructions carefully, ensuring that you provide your signature and enter your date of birth on the postal voting statement. The completed ballot paper and postal voting statement should be placed in the return envelope in your pack. You must return your postal vote so that it reaches the Electoral Registration Office by 10pm on Thursday 6 May 2021. If you miss the post, you can hand it in at the Electoral Registration Office or at any polling station in North Tyneside before 10pm on Thursday 6 May 2021.

How do I complete my ballot paper?

In the election for the Mayor you have two votes – one for a first choice and one for a second choice. You will be given a ballot paper like this:

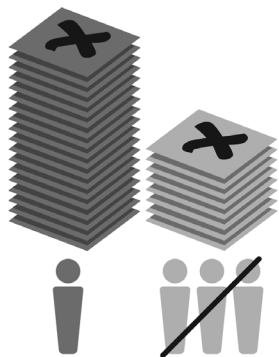
Mark an X in column 1 next to the name of the person who is your first choice for Mayor of North Tyneside. If you do not vote in this column, your ballot paper will not be counted.

Do not mark more than one X in each column.

Mark an X in column 2 next to the name of the person who would be your second choice for Mayor of North Tyneside. If you do not vote in this column, your first choice vote will still be counted. If you vote twice for the same candidate, your second vote will not be counted.

Who is elected?

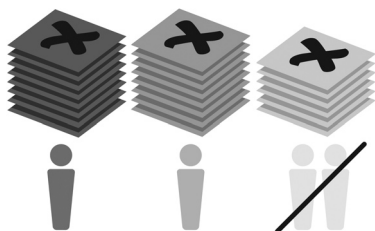
All the first choice votes are counted, and if one candidate has received **more than 50%** of the votes they will be elected Mayor of North Tyneside.



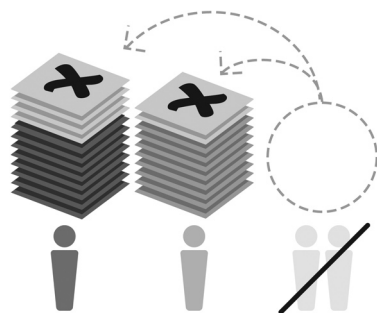
Mayor of North Tyneside



If no candidate has more than 50% of the votes, the two candidates with the most first choice votes will remain in the election and **all other candidates are eliminated**.



The ballot papers for the **eliminated candidates** are then checked. Any second choice votes for the two remaining candidates are added to their first round totals. The candidate with the most votes wins.



Mayoral Election Frequently asked questions

Why are there two votes for one Mayor?

The law states the voting process for the Mayoral election must be done this way. It also allows you to say who would be your second choice for Mayor if your first choice is not in the top two after the first round of counting, and if there is not an outright majority winner at that stage.

How do I mark my vote?

Vote ONCE (X) in column 1 for your first choice.
Vote ONCE (X) in column 2 for your second choice.

What happens if I don't make a second choice?

Your first choice vote will still be counted.

What happens if I only mark an X in the second choice (column 2)?

Your vote will not be counted because no one will know who your favourite candidate was.

What if I mark an X in the first choice column (column 1) for more than one candidate?

Your vote will not be counted. If you wish to vote for two candidates then you must mark an X in column 1 for your first choice candidate and also an X in column 2 for your second choice candidate.

I have an enquiry about this election, who do I contact?

If it is about how the election is being organised, please contact Electoral Services (contact details are shown on the back of this booklet). If it is about the voting system, you should contact your local MP.

I have forgotten to post my postal vote. Can I take it along to the polling station?

Yes, you can hand it into any polling station in North Tyneside between 7am and 10pm on election day, 6 May 2021.

Mayoral Election - 6 May 2021



Key dates

19 April

Deadline to register to vote in the Mayoral Election.

20 April

Last day to submit a **new application for a postal vote** - 5pm.

Last day for **changes to an existing absent vote (postal or proxy)** - 5pm.

If you haven't received your postal vote pack by 29 April please email **elections@northtyneside.gov.uk** or call **(0191) 643 2270**. We must receive your completed postal vote by 10pm on 6 May for it to be counted.

27 April

Last day to submit an application to vote by proxy. If you are a registered voter and you wish to apply for a new application to vote by proxy (someone to vote on your behalf) you must do this by 5pm on 27 April.

6 May

Polling day

Polling stations are open between **7am and 10pm** for you to vote in person at your local polling station.

Jack James Thomson
Your UK Independence Party (UKIP) Candidate

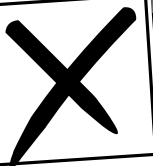

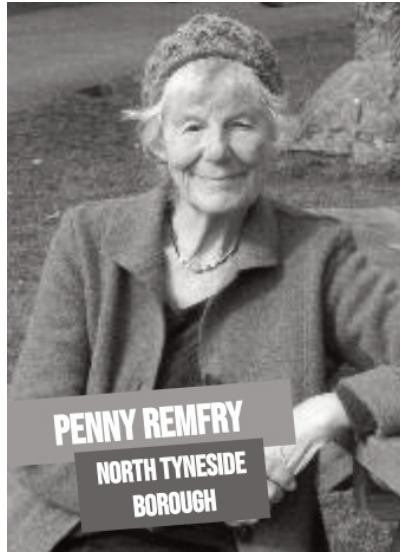
We have so much potential now to make the borough an even better place.

Lockdown gave us quieter roads, safer cycling and walking – good exercise! The **Sunrise Cycleway** was loved by many, hated by others, but experience from other areas shows that well-thought out schemes can *increase* footfall for shops.

- Keep pavements clear and clean, drains too
- Deal with **trip hazards** (I counted 98 in 7 streets – see photo!)
- Work with residents and businesses on cycle-ways

- Create more residents' parking schemes (“we have visitors too!”)
- Make **carbon-reduction** pleasant as well as vital!
