Election of the Mayor of Lewisham

On Thursday 7 March 2024 electors in Lewisham will have the opportunity to vote for the person they want to be the next Mayor of Lewisham.

The elected Mayor leads the Council. It is different to a ceremonial Mayor – in Lewisham this role is carried out by The Speaker of Lewisham.

This booklet must be sent to you by law. In it you will find information on how to vote and election statements from all of the mayoral candidates who chose to submit one.

The candidates are responsible for the information in their statements, provided they comply with legal requirements. The views expressed are their own.

Candidates' names and details appear in random order, which was decided by drawing lots.

Please remember that **you must now show a valid photo ID in order to vote in person at a polling station**. This is due to changes to election laws. You can find out what ID is acceptable in this booklet.

If you don't have a valid ID, you can apply for a special government-issued Voter Authority Certificate (VAC). You need to apply by 5pm on Wednesday 28 February. Applications can be made online: **gov.uk/applyforphotoidtovote**.



Here is a picture of what the ballot paper will look like. Note the mayoral ballot paper will be white. This picture is a guide only and may be subject to change.



Election information

On Thursday 7 March you will be able to vote for the directly elected mayor of Lewisham.

On election day, you will be given one ballot paper at the polling station.

The Mayor is now elected using the first past the post system. This is due to changes in electoral law. **It means** you will only have ONE vote for the candidate of your choice.

Your polling station is shown on the front of your poll card. Some polling stations have changed, so check the map on your poll card.

You can also find where your polling station is by visiting **lewisham.gov.uk/elections** or calling 020 8314 6086.

Voter information

Every registered elector receives a poll card which explains when, where and how to vote.

For details of your polling station, you can also visit **lewisham.gov.uk/elections**

Who can vote

You can vote in this election if you:

- are registered to vote in Lewisham
- are a British, Commonwealth, Irish or European Union citizen
- turned 18 on or before Thursday 7 March 2024

British overseas electors cannot vote in this election.

Postal voters

If you have registered for a postal vote, a pack will be posted to the address you requested arriving around 21 February. If you have not received it by Friday 1 March please email **electoral.services@lewisham.gov.uk** or call 020 8314 6086.

Please ensure your completed ballot is received by the Returning Officer before 10pm on Thursday 7 March. If you forget to post it, you can take it to any polling station on the day of the election.

Proxy voters

You can appoint someone else to cast your vote on your behalf if you wish. Proxy voter applications must be received by the Council by 5pm on Wednesday 28 February.

Emergency proxy voters

If you are unexpectedly taken ill or are suddenly called away for work purposes after 5pm on Wednesday 28 February and cannot go to vote in person you can appoint an emergency proxy to vote for you. You will have to give a reason why you cannot vote in person and your application must be supported by a doctor or your employer. To apply for a proxy vote visit **lewisham.gov.uk/elections** or call 020 8314 6086.

Poll cards

Don't worry if you lose your poll card. If you are on the register, you don't need a poll card to vote. You can attend the polling station and staff there will help you. The poll card is just to inform you that there is an election and explain where your polling station is. To find your polling station visit **lewisham.gov.uk/elections**

You must bring photo ID with you to vote

You will not be able to vote unless you show photographic identification to the polling station staff.

Accepted forms of photographic identification

You must present one of the following forms of photographic identification in order to vote in person at a polling station:

- A passport issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, a British Overseas Territory, an EEA state or a Commonwealth country
- A driving licence issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or an EEA state
- A biometric immigration document
- An identity card bearing the Proof of Age Standards Scheme hologram (a PASS card)
- Ministry of Defence Form 90 (Defence Identity Card)
- A Blue Badge
- A national identity card issued by an EEA state
- An Older Person's Bus Pass
- A Disabled Person's Bus Pass
- An Oyster 60+ Card
- A Freedom Pass
- A Scottish National Entitlement Card issued in Scotland

- A 60 and Over Welsh Concessionary Travel Card issued in Wales
- A Disabled Person's Welsh Concessionary Travel Card issued in Wales
- A Senior SmartPass issued in Northern Ireland
- A Registered Blind SmartPass or Blind Person's SmartPass issued in Northern Ireland
- A War Disablement SmartPass or War Disabled SmartPass issued in Northern Ireland
- A 60+ SmartPass issued in Northern Ireland
- A Half Fare SmartPass issued in Northern Ireland
- An Electoral Identity Card issued in Northern Ireland
- A Voter Authority Certificate or a temporary Voter Authority Certificate

If you do not possess any of the accepted forms of photographic identification, you can apply to your local Electoral Registration Officer for a free Voter Authority Certificate. Completed applications must reach us by 5pm on Wednesday 28 February.

Apply online voter-authority-certificate.service.gov.uk

If your photographic identification document has expired it will still be accepted so long as the photograph is still a good likeness of you, unless it is a temporary Voter Authority Certificate which is not valid for use on the date of poll.

You may be required to provide further proof of identity if there is any discrepancy between your name as shown on your form of photographic identification and the name of the elector that you claim to be.

Why abolish the Mayor?

Labour think they've got it in the bag. Lewisham is a one-party state, and having a directly elected Mayor is dangerous, especially where there is no opposition.

Already we have seen a number of cases around the country where questionable decisions have been made – Liverpool and Tower Hamlets, for example. I am keen to be a "one term Mayor", seeking to abolish the elected Mayor system and return to a powerful democratic committee system where councilors elect a leader each year.

Stand with Gaza - Liberation For Palestine Now!

If elected as Mayor I will be calling for the borough to twin with Gaza. I have joined residents marching in support of Palestinians in Gaza and the West Bank, on some of the largest marches seen in the borough since the Save Lewisham Hospital campaign.

Compulsory purchase of long term empty residential dwellings.

Greater use of empty dwelling management orders to tackle empty homes.

End disrepair in private rented homes where the tenants are at risk from Category 1 hazards.

Keep council services in house – keep public money out of private hands.
