## East Midlands Combined County Authority Mayoral Election

On Thursday 2 May 2024, residents in Derbyshire, Nottinghamshire, Derby and Nottingham will vote for the first ever Mayor for the East Midlands Combined County Authority (EMCCA).

The Mayor will work with councils in the Combined County Authority area to maximise its potential as a place to live, visit, work and do business. They will have the powers and responsibilities to make decisions across the whole EMCCA area.

- information about the election
- an election address (i.e. a statement) from each of the Mayoral candidates who wish to be included
- information on how to vote and completing your ballot papers.

## EMCCA Mayoral Election - Information for voters

#### 1. Voting at a polling station

You should by now have received a poll card with information about voting and your polling station. Make sure to check this, as your polling station may have changed. You don't need to take the card with you to vote, unless you are an anonymous voter. You can find your polling station by visiting: www.wheredoivote.co.uk

#### 2. Postal voting

The first issue of postal ballot packs will be sent out on **Wednesday 17 April 2024**. The second issue of postal ballot packs will be sent out on **Monday 22 April 2024**. You must return your postal vote, so it reaches your Local Returning Officer by **10pm** on **Thursday 2 May 2024**. If you miss the post, you can hand it into your local council offices during office hours to a person authorised to receive postal votes, or at a polling station in your local council area before **10pm** on **Thursday 2 May 2024**.\*

\* You can only hand in your own postal pack and postal packs for up to five other electors. If you hand in any more than that, only your own will be accepted. When handing in any pack(s), you will also be required to complete a form.

#### 3. Apply to vote by proxy

You can appoint someone you trust to vote on your behalf as a proxy, they will also need to be registered to vote and be able to attend your polling station. New applications must be received by **5pm** on **Wednesday 24 April 2024**.

Emergency proxy voting may be available in certain situations. More information and apply online at

#### 4. Do you have the correct Voter ID to vote in person?

You need to show photo ID when voting in person at a polling station. These must be original documents, but they can have expired if the photo still looks like you. The name on your ID must be the same one you used to register to vote, but you can bring additional original evidence if it's not, like a marriage certificate. #### 5. Don't have the right ID? Get a Voter ID Certificate

Apply for your free Voter Authority Certificate by **5pm** on **Wednesday 24 April 2024** at www.gov.uk/apply-for-photo-id-voter-authority-certificate or scan the QR code.



#### 6. What to expect at the polling station?

On Thursday 2 May 2024, polling stations will be open from 7am until 10pm. **Remember to bring your photo ID with you.** When you arrive, staff will ask for your name and address, check the electoral register and your photo ID, and, if accepted, issue your ballot papers.

There will be measures in place to support voters with disabilities. Contact your local council for more information.

#### 7. How to vote on polling day

You will receive two ballot papers:


- Combined County Authority Mayoral paper will look like this and will be GREEN
- Police and Crime Commissioner election paper will be YELLOW

You have ONE vote on each of your ballot papers

- Read the ballot papers and instructions at the top carefully
- Decide who you want to vote for
- Vote for your chosen candidate by putting an X in the box to the right of their name
- Once done, fold the papers, return to the desk, and place each paper in the appropriate ballot box.

Do not put your paper(s) in the ballot box if you make a mistake, just ask the staff and they will be able to advise you and re-issue your paper(s), if necessary.

The candidate who gets the highest number of votes will be declared the Mayor for the EMCCA, with the result declared on Friday 3 May 2024 here - www.eastmidlandsdevolution.co.uk

## East Midlands Combined County Authority & Mayor

The East Midlands Combined County Authority (EMCCA) has been made possible because of a devolution deal between the government and the four upper tier councils of Derbyshire, Nottinghamshire, Derby and Nottingham.

The EMCCA, led by the Mayor, has been given powers, functions and funding worth £1.14 billion from the government. It means that decisions about investment in our areas, which are currently taken by central government, will be made locally.

The EMCCA will work with councils across Derbyshire, Nottinghamshire, Derby and Nottingham to deliver the best possible outcomes for residents and businesses.

As part of the devolution deal, the EMCCA must have a directly elected mayor. The Government believes a Mayor means clearer accountability over local powers, functions and funding. A key part of the role is to act as an advocate and global ambassador for the Combined County Authority area and the 2.2 million residents who live here.

The Mayor leads the Combined County Authority, working with partner councils, business representatives and stakeholders on areas like transport, housing, regeneration, employment and skills, economic investment and the net-zero ambition.

The Mayor's term of office will run for four years.


