# Introduction

# On Thursday 2 May 2024 there will be an election of a Mayor for a new North East Mayoral Combined Authority.

People who are registered to vote in local elections for any of the seven constituent councils (County Durham, Gateshead, Newcastle, North Tyneside, Northumberland, South Tyneside or Sunderland) are eligible to vote in this election.

The new Mayor will work alongside those councils in a new authority that will have additional funding and local decision-making powers from central government. There will be no change to the way your local council operates.

This booklet must be sent to each registered elector by Law\*. It includes:

- Information about the election
- An election address (i.e. a statement) from each of the mayoral candidates who wish to be included in this booklet
- Information on how to fill in your ballot paper and how the result will be calculated
- Contact details for your local Electoral Services Office

# The Candidates

# Why this is happening?

The election of the Mayor is possible because of a devolution deal agreed between government and local leaders. The deal was approved locally following a public consultation between January and March 2023.

The deal agreed, which could be worth up to £4.2bn over 30 years, means that decisions about investment in areas including transport, skills, housing and regeneration, which are currently made by central government, will be made in the North East.

# The role of the Mayor

The Mayor will work alongside council leaders to form the Cabinet for the new North East Mayoral Combined Authority. Voting members of the cabinet are the Mayor and seven elected members – one from each council. The Mayor will chair Cabinet meetings and provide leadership for the new authority.

# There are six candidates standing for Mayor of the North East Mayoral Combined Authority.

All candidates you are able to vote for on **Thursday 2 May 2024** are listed in alphabetical order below. This is the order they will appear on the ballot paper.

# **How You Can Vote**

# **The Voting System**

You will vote once for one candidate by putting an 'X' in the box next to your choice on the ballot paper, which will be lemon coloured for this election.

Votes from all seven constituent local authorities will then be totalled together when the count takes place on Friday 3 May 2024, and the candidate with the highest number of votes overall will be elected as Mayor.

# If you vote at a polling station

Before **Thursday 2 May 2024**, you should receive a poll card including details of where your specific polling station is, what photo ID is acceptable and what to do if you can't vote in person on polling day.

Your photo ID, which must be shown before you are given a ballot paper, has to be an original document, not a photocopy or a photo on your phone. Expired documents are acceptable provided that the photo is still a good likeness of you. If you don't have any of the acceptable forms of photo ID, you can apply for a free type of ID, known as a Voter Authority Certificate (VAC) at www.gov.uk/apply-for-photo-id-voter-authority-certificate or via your local Electoral Services Office. The deadline to apply for this is 5pm on Wednesday 24 April 2024. It may take time to process your application so please apply as soon as you can.

Your polling station will be open between **7am** and **10pm** on **Thursday 2 May 2024**. Staff will ask for your name and address to confirm you are registered and check your photo ID to confirm your identity before issuing a ballot paper. You will be issued either one or two other differently coloured ballot papers, depending on where you live, for other elections on the same day.

If you would prefer to vote by post, you must apply by **5pm** on **Wednesday 17 April 2024**. You can apply at **www.gov.uk/apply-postal-vote** or by contacting your local Electoral Services Office. Photo ID is not required for a postal vote.

If you would prefer for someone to vote on your behalf, you can apply for a proxy vote at www.gov.uk/apply-proxy-vote or by contacting your local Electoral Services Office. The deadline is **5pm** on Wednesday **24** April **2024** and your proxy needs to have photo ID.

# If you vote by post

You will receive a postal poll card telling you when your postal vote will be sent and what address it will be delivered to.

Your postal vote must reach your Local Returning Officer by **10pm** on **Thursday 2 May 2024**. If you miss the post, you can hand it in at your polling station or at the council office specified by your Local Returning Officer. There are new rules about handing in postal votes so please read the instructions with your postal ballot pack carefully if you intend to return your postal vote by hand, or it may be rejected.



# **Candidate information**

Each candidate was given the opportunity to provide an Election Address (i.e. a statement) to be included in this booklet.

Four candidates chose to do so and they have each paid £3,500 towards the production cost of this booklet.

The content of each Election Address to be included in this booklet has been provided by the candidate. The views expressed are theirs alone and cannot be attributed to the Combined Authority Returning Officer.

Lots were drawn to decide the order in which the Election Addresses appear in the booklet.

# **GUY RENNER-THOMPSON** A STRONG LOCAL VOICE, AND A MAYOR FOR THE WHOLE OF THE NORTH EAST

The North East is a region with a proud history. The home of the Industrial Revolution. The North East has been leading Britain for centuries.

Our new Devolution Deal is the next chapter in our long story. The deal unlocks over £4.2 billion and transfers power from London to local leaders like Guy who know what our communities need and want.

# I'M JAMIE DRISCOLL

I'm an engineer. My Dad was a tank driver. My Mam was a youth worker and set up a women's refuge from domestic violence. I left school at 16 and worked in a plumbing factory. I got an engineering degree from Northumbria University as a mature student, and set up my own business.

I live in Newcastle with my wife, who's an NHS doctor, and our two children.

When I was elected North of Tyne Mayor in 2019 I made an election promise to negotiate a new devolution deal covering the wider North East.

I've met with countless ministers and reminded them the North doesn't stop at Manchester. I worked cross-party to secure the best funded devolution deal in the country. £6.1 billion for the North East. I kept my promise.
